From the Parents


At times like these your feedback is important to us. We hope we are doing things right, but in these unprecedented times it is important to hear from you so that we know what is working.






Creating a Soap Opera




Year 7 drama students have been creating their own tv series based on a haunted house. A great piece of work by one student who has really considered how the house would look and their characters involved in it.





A brilliant map created by Jack B for his Soap Opera that he is making










